\*There remain only 6 Diploma programs in Ohio.

There are no statistics available through the OBN of the number of RN to BSN graduates as far as group 2 is aware of at this point in time.

It was mentioned that we should try to develop a task force to draft a document to see if we can find this data element through the OBN.
